Health in the White House Topic of Keuka Community Luncheon

KEUKA PARK, N.Y. – Keuka College’s Community Luncheon Series will continue Thursday, June 16, with a talk by Robert J. Joynt, Distinguished University Professor of neurology at the University of Rochester.

Joynt will discuss “Health, Illness and Death in the White House” at noon in the Gannett Room of the Lightner Library.

The author of numerous scientific publications, Joynt has earned international recognition for his leadership in neurological teaching, practice, and research. He serves as editor of *Baker and Joynt’s Clinical Neurology*, is a founding editor of *Seminars of Neurology*, and recently co-edited chapter 11 of *Managing Crisis: Presidential Disability and the 25th Amendment*. He was chief editor of the *Archives of Neurology* for 15 years.



He has served as vice president and vice provost for health affairs, dean of the School of Medicine and Dentistry, and chair of the Department of Neurology at the University of Rochester.

The recipient of numerous honors and awards, Joynt is a frequent consultant and lecturer, and serves on the boards of Blue Cross-Blue Shield, the United Way of Rochester, the Eastman Dental Center, Ithaca College, and the Genesee Valley Trust Co.
