Hallam and Tuttle Selected Division Chairs

KEUKA PARK, N.Y.—Professor of Psychology **Steve Hallam (Penn Yan, N.Y.)** and Assistant Professor of Management **Ann Tuttle (Watkins Glen, N.Y.)** were selected by their colleagues to chair the Division of Basic and Applied Social Sciences and the Division of Business and Management, respectively.

The chair position is a three-year commitment, renewable by consent of the faculty in the division. Hallam replaces Professor of Psychology Michael Rogoff and Tuttle replaces Associate Professor of Management Gary Smith.

Hallam earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from SUNY New Paltz and master's and doctoral degrees (both in psychology) from the University of Binghamton. He came to Keuka in fall 1991, and serves on the Faculty Development Committee and the Institutional Effectiveness Task Force, and advises the Tennis Club. Hallam has peer-reviewed scientific publications to his credit.



“Serving as chair represents an opportunity to do something different and more challenging,” said Hallam. “I have been teaching essentially the same courses at Keuka College for more than 10 years. And while teaching is challenging—challenging in ways that people don't always appreciate—administrative work will require me to develop different skills—skills that are less natural for me. I am also hopeful that I can lead our division in a positive direction, providing the College with academically and financially effective programs for years to come.”

Tuttle earned a bachelor's degree in business education from SUNY Buffalo and a master's in business administration from Syracuse University. She came to Keuka as an adjunct faculty member in 1995, was hired part-time as an assistant professor in 1998. She went full-time in 2000.



A member of the Society for Human Resource Management and the College's Curriculum Committee, Tuttle chaired the College's Instruction Committee last year. She is a member of the SIFE (Students in Free Enterprise) team's board of advisers, a past adviser for Sigma

Lambda Sigma (the College's honor society) and member of the Keuka College Golf Classis Committee. Her article, "Long-Term Temps Vulnerable to Abuse," was published in *The Central New York Business Journal* in 1992, and her organization behavior syllabus was featured in *The Chronicle of Higher Education* last semester.

"I am honored to have been selected, and will do my very best to represent both the Division of Business and Management and Keuka College with the utmost of dignity and professionalism," said Tuttle. "I have loved my time at Keuka College and have been privileged to teach and, in many cases, get to know hundreds of amazing students. I look forward to the experience and challenge of chairing the Division of Business and Management."
