North Carolina's Montrose A. Streeter Named Assistant Dean of Students

KEUKA COLLEGE, N.Y.—Montrose A. Streeter, former area coordinator in charge of student housing assignments for North Carolina School of the Arts, has been named Keuka College's assistant dean of students.

He is responsible for residence life and multicultural affairs. "I feel it's the place for me to be," said Streeter, who will interact daily with Keuka students when they return from Field Period, a month-long internship where they gain real-world experience, in February. "It's a great opportunity to develop and grow my personal and professional gifts and abilities to enhance and educate the Keuka community."



"Because Montrose brings to Keuka many years of excellent experience in both residence life and multicultural affairs, he will have an immediate and positive impact on student life at the College," said Vice President for Student Development and Dean of Students Jim Blackburn. "Students will find him (Montrose) to be warm and engaging, and also professionally competent. All students, including our students of diverse ethnic backgrounds, will have in Montrose a senior administrator who can serve their individual needs and help them grow and mature. I am enormously excited to have Dean Streeter on our student affairs staff."

Streeter completed an internship in the dean of student services office at Wake Forest University (Winston-Salem, N.C.) last fall. Prior to his position with the School of the Arts, he was the director of residence life at Barton College (Wilson, N.C.). In addition to his residence life experience, Streeter has held admissions posts at Mary Washington College (Fredericksburg, Va.) and The University of Tennessee, Knoxville.

Streeter holds a master of science degree in adult education from North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University (Greensboro, N.C.). He earned a bachelor's degree in religion from Wake Forest University (Winston-Salem, N.C.) and an associate's degree in religion from Lees McRae College (Banner Elk, N.C.).
