NEAC President's Cup Stays Put

KEUKA PARK, N.Y.—The North Eastern Athletic Conference (NEAC) President's Cup will continue to reside on the shores of Keuka Lake.

That's because Keuka College claimed the cup, symbolic of the top overall program in the conference, for the third year in a row.

The conference awards five President's Cup points for finishing first in the regular season, four points for second place, three points for third place, two points for fourth, and one point for fifth, while the post-season tournament winner receives two bonus points and the runner-up gets one bonus point.



Keuka garnered 37 President's Cup points for the 2003-04 season, followed by Medaille College (29), Cazenovia College (27), D'Youville College (23.5), and Hilbert College (21.5).

Keuka captured regular season conference crowns in five of the eight sports the conference sponsored last season. The Storm finished in sole possession of first in men's soccer, women's soccer, women's cross country, and women's basketball, and shared the volleyball crown with Medaille.

Keuka won post-season tournament titles in men's soccer, women's basketball, and baseball, and finished second in women's soccer.

The NEAC will field 12 teams in 2004-05. Joining holdovers Keuka, Cazenovia and D'Youville are: Baptist Bible College (Clarks Summit, Pa.), Bard College (Annadale-On-Hudson, N.Y.), Chestnut Hill College (Philadelphia, Pa.), Keystone College (La Plume, Pa.), Pennsylvania State University-Berks (Reading, Pa.), Philadelphia Biblical University (Langhorne, Pa.), Polytechnic University (Brooklyn, N.Y.), SUNY Purchase (Purchase, N.Y.), and Villa Julie College (Stevenson, Md.).
